The Colonel John M. McHugh Tuition Fairness for Survivors Act passed in the House without objection this week. – Spouses, kids of vets who die from service injuries guaranteed <u>in-state</u> tuition rate

Earlier this week, House lawmakers gave final approval to the Hire Veteran Health Heroes Act, which requires Veterans Affairs leaders to work with Defense Department officials to identify separating troops with health care occupations who may help fill open medical jobs in veterans hospitals.
